

# Rev. Jackson warns mortgage crisis will hit 2 million homeowners by 2008

CHICAGO - With 2 million homes nation-wide at risk of foreclosure by 2008, Rev. Jesse Jackson, founder and president of Rairbow PUSH Coalition, recently used his weekly television program Upfront with Rev. Jackson to explore how government and financial institutions must restruc-

ture mortgage systems to avoid an economic crisis that could trigger a devastating recession.

"When people lose their homes, property values go down; tax revenues that pay for local schools and police officers all sink," Rev. Jackson said. "The water is rising and whole cities will drown."

Joining Rev. Jackson on Upfront were Michael Van Zalingen, Director of Homeownership Services at Neighborhood Housing Services of Chicago; Rev. Greg Livingston, national field secretary for the Rainbow PUSH Coalition; Tom Jones, senior assistant attorney general, consumers

counsel; and Bonita Parker, board member of Rainbow PUSH Coalition and chief of staff for Alderman Sandi Jackson (7th Ward).

As the teaser interest rates that attracted many homebuyers in recent years are expiring, sharply elevated

# Jena-Nati – Got Protest?

By. James Clingman I live in Cincinnati, Ohio, a place I sometimes call Cincinn-apathy; I now call it "Jena-Nati."

Let me also say that you probably live in a Jena too, as most Black people in this country suffer from some kind of discriminatory practice in business, the courts, or in politics. My goal is not only to point out this particular city and the way Black folks are mistreated; it is also to stimulate us to take appropriate action against the many adverse issues we face in our daily lives.

Jena-Nati is basically a Black and White city; the Asian and Hispanic population hovers around 3 percent. Yet, Blacks, who comprise more than 45 percent of the population, are treated, and in some cases allow ourselves to be treated as if we are a just a handful, which still would be no excuse to be mistreated nor to accept mistreatment.

Over the past several months we have been witness to a myriad of blatantly discriminatory court cases against Black people. We had our own case of the "Dog Days" of summer where a Black woman was slammed in jail, without bail, for a dead dog that was found in

# Vernice Armour



Vernice Armour was born in Chicago, IL in 1973 and grew up in Memphis, TN. Vernice marched in the military boot steps of both her dad, Clarence Jackson, a former Marine, who married Vernice's mother, Authurine, and her father, Gaston C. Armour Jr. of Chicago, a retired major in the U.S. Army Reserves.

In 1993, the future combat pilot enlisted in the Army Reserves and a few months later joined the Army ROTC program while enrolled at Middle Tennessee State

University (MTSU).

Vernice was the second woman and first African American woman on the Nashville Police Department's motorcycle squad.

Following college she was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps on December 12, 1998. The ambitious pilot ranked No. 1 out her class of 12 and of the last 200 to graduate from flight school. As the top graduate, she made the Naval Air Station's prestigious Commodore's List, received the Academic Achievement Award and subsequently made history as the Marine Corps first African-American female pilot.

One of the few and the proud, during the start of the war in March 2003, United States Marine Corps Captain Armour was one of 1,500 female Marines in the Persian Gulf fighting to dismantle the regime

of Saddam Hussein in Operation Iraqi Freedom. She completed two combat tours of duty in the Gulf.

With her departure out of the Marine Corps in June 2007, Vernice continues to pursue her

passions as an author, professional speaker, and trainer; addressing professional organizations, businesses, and schools, emphasizing leadership, pursuing your passion in life, education, and taking positive steps to reach goals.



## Religious Finances And Senate Watchdogs

Sen. Charles Grassley of Iowa, the ranking Republican on the Senate Finance Committee, raised quite a few eyebrows when news broke that he had launched an extensive investigation into the possible misuse of donations by six celebrity television evangelists.

The luxurious lifestyles of some of America's top preachers have been criticized at various times by disgruntled employees, disillusioned donors, media investigators, and religious watchdog organizations. Sen. Grassley said his investigation was triggered by news reports and growing complaints from the public.

Sen. Grassley sent notice letters demanding audited financial statements, details on executives' pay, minutes from board meetings, and a host of other fishing expedition inquiries to Benny Hinn of World Healing Center Church Grapevine, Texas; Randy and Paula White of Tampa, Fla.; David and Joyce Meyer of Joyce Meyer Ministries of Fenton, Mo.; Kenneth and Gloria Copeland of Copeland Kenneth Ministries of Newark, Texas; Bishop Eddie Long of New Birth Missionary Baptist Church of Lithonia, Ga., and Creflo and Taffi Dollar of World Changers Church International of College Park, Ga.

The Senator stated, "I don't want to conclude that there's a problem, but I have an obligation to donors and the taxpayers to find out more. People who donated should have their money spent as intended and in

adherence with the tax code."

It's interesting how the Senator is willing to get involved in the financial oversight of these religious ministries concerning matters that would best be left to the nation's taxing agency, the IRS. Grassley's office told the Tampa Tribune that one of the reasons for his involvement is the IRS "has been unable to keep up with the exponential growth of all tax-exempt organizations, including churches and ministries."

This is another signal for the public to be alarmed regarding escalating government intru-Even though sion. Grassley's finance committee has jurisdiction over non-profits and oversight of the IRS the question becomes is this the most cost effective use of the committee's time and resources?

Senator, if you truly desire to put your investigative skills to good use for the public good here are just a few of the blatant menagerie of questionable capers perpetrated by the federal government on the American people. The list is not comprehensive but illustrates the dire need for lifting the veil of secrecy and providing the transparency that your committee espouses.

You can start with Mr. Cheney and the energy task force he chaired. According to media reports energy industry representatives such as then Enron President and Chairman Kenneth Lay and lobbyists Haley Barbour and Marc Racicot participated in the Task Force meetings. All had intimate ties to both President Bush and the Vice President

The administration has refused to turn over documents to the General Accounting Office listing the attendees at each of the meetings and their roles citing executive privilege to keep the records confidential.

Doesn't the American public have a right to know if self serving executives industry helped develop the nation's energy policy and to what extent they and their companies may have received financial benefit as a result of those policies?

When Paul Bremer left his provisional post in Iraq \$9 billion dollars in cash that supposedly had been passed on to the new Iraqi government got lost and none of the federal watchdogs have accepted the challenge to investigate. It is simply not believable that the Administration lost track of every dime of the funds.

Is there some reason the Congress refuses to investigate these financial boondoggles but are eager to convene multiple hearings into questionable UN Oil-for-food allegations?

Do we even need to mention the Iraq reconstruction fiasco as another egregious source of financial impropriety? Most of the American money allocated for reconstruction efforts has gone to American consultants or directly into contractors' accounts. The evidence of blatant fraud is disappearing as contractors and government agencies cover up spending by using unaccountable and untraceable financial procedures.

The financial mismanagement was so blatant the agencies and contractors did not even try to hide it. Contracts were paid in stacks of \$100 dollar bill known as bricks. Money was carried around and transported stuffed in military duffel bags. Why pay in cash bricks except to leave no paper or electronic trail?

Auditors of the US Special Inspector General for Iraqi Reconstruction (SIGIR) report that most of the projects planned to rebuild Iraq's sewerage, irrigation, drainage, hospitals, dams and training facilities have been subject to waste, fraud, and corruption at levels that stagger the imagination.

While the "prosperity gospel" of televangelists may be controversial, unorthodox, unpopular or highly questionable, congressional oversight committees have higher priority issues thev should be addressing. Ministries should be open and transparent about their finances and Christians are charged in Scripture to be "above reproach." However, the donors to religious organizations have a choice to give or not to give whereas funds being misused by the federal government are taxpaver dollars taken under threat of law.

To paraphrase Sen. Grassley, "the people who pay the taxes have a right to know how their money is being spent." If only the congressional oversight committees would make it so.

# U.S. destroyer pursuing hijacked ship in Somali waters, military says

WASHINGTON (CNN) -- A U.S. destroyer has entered Somali territorial waters in pursuit of a Japanese-owned ship loaded with benzene that was hijacked by pirates over the weekend, military officials said Monday.

The guided-missile destroyer USS Arleigh Burke entered Somali waters with the permission of the troubled transitional government in Mogadishu, U.S. officials said. In recent years, warships have stayed outside the 12-mile limit when chasing pirates.

The ongoing operation

was confirmed to CNN by two military officials familiar with the details. Gunmen aboard two skiffs hijacked the Panamanian-flagged Golden Mori off the Socotra archipelago, near the Horn of Africa, said Andrew Mwangura, a spokesman for Kenya's Seafarers' Assistance Programme.

The Golden Mori radioed for help Sunday night. The Burke's sister ship, the USS Porter, opened fire and sank the pirate skiffs tied to its stern before the Burke took over shadowing the hijacked vessel.



When the shots were fired, it was not known the ship was filled with highly flammable benzene. U.S. military officials indicate there is a great deal of concern about the cargo because it is so sensitive.

Benzene, which U.S. authorities have declared a known human carcinogen,

solvent and to make plastics and synthetic

fabrics.

U.S. and NATO warships have been patrolling off the Horn of Africa for several years in an effort to crack down on piracy off Somalia, where a U.N.backed transitional government is struggling to restore order after 15 years of near-anarchy. In June, the destroyer USS Carter Hall fired warning shots in an attempt to stop a hijacked Danish cargo ship off Somalia, but the American vessel had to turn away when the pirated ship entered Somali waters.

In May, a U.S. Navy advisory warned merchant ships to stay at least 200 miles off the Somali coast. But the U.S. Maritime Administration said pirates sometimes issue false distress calls to lure ships closer to shore.

The pirates are often armed with automatic

rifles and shoulder-fired rockets, according to a recent warning from the agency.

"To date, vessels that increase speed and take evasive maneuvers avoid boarding, while those that slow down are boarded, taken to the Somali coastline and released after successful ransom payment, often after protracted negotiations of as much as 11 weeks," it advised.

The agency issued a new warning to sailors in the Gulf of Aden, between Somalia and Yemen, after Sunday's hijacking was reported

# Doctors Needed ASAP in Liberia, Prez Wins Prize

Doctor to Patient Ratio is 1 to 50,000 President Sirleaf Johnson Received U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom

GIN) – Health care is free for now in Liberia, but the odds of finding a doctor for a sick patient are one in fifty thousand. Health Minister Walter Gwenigale says Liberia needs at least 1,200 doctors but currently it has only 120.

And 70 of those are foreign doctors with international organisations and the U.N.

"We're talking about a doctor to patient ratio of one to 50,000," said former Health Minister Peter Coleman." That puts a lot of stress on the professionals.

"What we really need," said Minister Gwenigale, "but what donors will not fund is the money to pay doctors not to go overseas -- and hopefully to tempt back medical staff who fled during the war and are now earning better money in other countries.

Liberia has one medical college which turns out between six and 12 grad-

uates each year and numerous nursing schools in the capital Monrovia.

Liberia's Ministry of Health has temporarily eliminated all fees at government-run hospitals and clinics in the country.

Meanwhile, President Ellen Sirleaf Johnson on Nov. 5, will receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the U.S. government's highest honorary award to civilians, it was announced this

President Bush said he was bestowing the honor in recognition of her efforts to help heal a country torn apart by conflict through perseverance, personal courage and an unwavering commitment to building a more hopeful future for her homeland. Other winners include Cuban anti-abortion activist Oscar Elias Biscet, civil rights leader Benjamin Hooks; former Republican congressman and pro-life activist Henry Hyde, Brian Lamb, co-founder the C-SPAN cable network; economist Gary Becker; Francis Collins, director of the National Human Research Genome InstituteHarper Lee, author of "To Kill a Mockingbird," which helped focus the country on the struggle for equality

her car, but she did not do one day in jail, even though her 2 yearold baby died in 100 degree heat.

Our latest case involves a Black man, Marc Frison, who inadvertently left a small knife in his backpack when he went through the metal detector in the courthouse. Instead of taking the knife and holding it until Mr. Frison left the building, the guard arrested him. That was approximate-

ly two months ago. He still sits in jail, on a \$100,000 cash bond, having had no trial. The NAACP protested his incarceration and the unconstitutional and punitive bond received; the judge complained extended Frison's time in jail by refusing to hear his case in a timely manner. As of this writing, Frison is still in jail awaiting trial on November 13.

Now you would think, just as they do in airports, that a small knife in a backpack would simply be confiscated or the person carrying it would be refused entry to the building. He forgot it was inside his bag, just as the white lady "forgot" her baby was in her car for 8 hours

her car for 8 hours.

Obviously, the "I forgot" excuse does not work for Black people in Jena-Nati.

The Frison case has sparked the interest of U.S. Judiciary Chairman, John Conyers, who wrote to the Assistant Attorney General in the Civil Rights Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, asking for an investigation of this apparent violation of Mr. Frison's civil right against being "improperly detained" and, Conyers wrote, "broader discrimination concerns."

Here is a quote from a letter written by the Local President of the NAACP, Christopher Smitherman. "Marc Frison has been recently placed on 24 hour lock-down, been denied his ability to shower, and been denied access to phone calls to his family.

Marc Frison has not been convicted of any crime. In fact, he is awaiting trial on a \$100,000 straight bond.

On November 8, in response to the continuous injustices perpetrated against Black people in Jena-Nati, Smitherman began a hunger strike, which he says he will not end until justice comes to Marc Frison. This is a serious response by Smitherman; he and his wife have four young boys and are expecting a daughter in a few months.

Now the worst part. Smitherman, who is only 40 years of age, won the Presidency of the NAACP, he has been subjected "Black-lash" from older so-called "Black leaders." Yes, I said "Black-lash." I am almost ashamed to say that several "has beens who still wannabe" have tried to undermine everything he has done - and believe me, he has done quite a lot since taking office. Again, typical of Jenawhenever a committed Black man stands up against the establishment, other Blacks are "sent," after receiving their 30 pieces of silver, of course, to destroy him. And they feel no shame in going against their own people

The latest case of Black-on-Black crime against this strong brother and conscious Black people in Jena-Nati took place during the recent campaign to pass a sales tax to build a new jail. "Leading Blacks" and "chosen Blacks" in Jena-Nati, including some Black preachers who were paid off by white folks, came against the NAACP membership, which voted to oppose the tax. They lost; the tax failed. Chalk up one for Black consciousness in Jena-Nati.

Did I mention the NAACP, which has yet to speak out against this injustice, will hold its National Convention in Jena-Nati next year? That ought to be a real hoot!



anything like it", says Henderson, "especially for a new theatre that's not yet established. She goes on to say, "But to me the measure of success is not in the number of kids we sign up nor the number of tickets sold, to me success comes if just one single child is enriched by theatre. interest rates and higher housing costs are hitting homeowners who have adjustable rate mortgages (ARM) and subprime loans. With less easy credit available, many who expected to refinance at lower interest rates cannot do so. And millions are losing their homes.

These devastating events did not happen because of job loss, divorce or medical bills said Rev. Jackson. Rather, they happened because of the predatory nature of the loan product. Predatory lending will potentially add another 10 million to the foreclosure list The exorbitant interest rates and inflexible terms have locked borrowers into loans they cannot refinance and have no ability to pay Families facing foreclosure often cannot locate the company that holds their loan. Once granted, loans typically are

investments to creditors who have no knowledge of or involvement in homeowner's being.

Mortgages used to be stable investments but now everyone is losing money as a result of these sub-prime practices Parker said.

In addition the community disruption of lost homes, financial structures nationwide and globally will suffer, Parker said. When people take out a loan from the bank, their loans end up being a part of the mortgage-backed securities on the stock market," she explained. Thus, while there is discussion of a government bailout, banks as well as homeowners are losing money at an alarming

Unlike traditional loans, banks do not put these [sub-prime loans] on their books Jones said. So when people try to complain, they do not have a bank to go to; they have services Jones's solution is to rewrite the loans to accommodate what

homeowners can afford. Citing fraud as a factor, Van Zalingen said the problem is too widespread for simple solutions. One of 10 houses on every block in America is facing foreclosure," he said. Though help will be costly, he said, two months of wasted funding on [the war in] Iraq would allow for the type of restructuring needed Rev. Livingston, who traveled with Rev. Jackson recently on a foreclosure tour visiting six Michigan cities, said that easy credit lured many homebuyers into unmanageable borrowing. "You have to look at the fact that a consumer who could not qualify

to buy a car could turn around and buy a house," he said. "Nodocument loans were designed to shield the wealthy and have sadly come to take advantage of the disadvantage."






