Obama Won't Be First Black President

Were there other "black" presidents? Some historians have reason to believe people don't really understand the genealogy of past U.S. Presidents.

Research shows at least five U.S. presidents had black ancestors and Thomas Jefferson, the nation's third president, was considered the first black president, according to historian Leroy Vaughn, author of *Black People*


and *Their Place in World History*.

Vaughn's research shows Jefferson was not the only former black U.S. president. Who were the others? Andrew Jackson, Abraham Lincoln, Warren Harding and Calvin

Coolidge. But why was this unknown? How were they elected president? All five of these presidents never acknowledged their black ancestry.

Jefferson, who served

On the verge of commemorating the Martin Luther King National Holiday Jan. 19, Martin Luther King III, has declared "We've got to


roll up our sleeves" during what he describes as "a very special period in the history of our nation and world."

Speaking last week to the ceremonial swearing in of the Congressional Black Caucus, King says America must remind

itself that despite the historic swearing in of the nation's first Black president Jan. 20, his father's "dream has not been fulfilled even though a significant aspect of that dream has been fulfilled."

Sitting aside a prepared

Plano Celebrates Martin Luther King, Jr. Birthday

In 1983, the 98th Congress passed Public Law 98-144 to honor the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. This was first celebrated as a Federal legal holiday on January 20, 1986 and has been

observed on the third Monday of January since that time. Congress' intention was that the holiday "serve as a time for Americans to reflect on the principles of racial equality and social change espoused by Martin Luther King, Jr." (36 USC, Section 169). Dr.

King gained national prominence during the Montgomery Bus Boycott. The boycott began when Rosa Parks, a 42 year old seamstress refused to give up her seat to a white man on December 1, 1955. A Montgomery city ordinance at that time required

black individuals to give up their seats to white individuals. The boycott lasted 381 days and served as the impetus in the creation of Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

From this point forward,

Carolyn Cheeks Kilpatrick

Congresswoman Carolyn Cheeks Kilpatrick (MI-13) secured membership on two powerful U.S. House Appropriations Subcommittees—the Defense Subcommittee and the Transportation/Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Subcommittee—during the historic 111th Congress.

Congresswoman Kilpatrick is the first African American woman and the second woman in the history of our country to serve on the Defense Subcommittee, which is the largest appropriations bill

in the federal government. The Defense Subcommittee has jurisdiction over the Departments of the Army, Navy (including Marine Corps), Air Force, Office of the Secretary of Defense, Central Intelligence Agency, Intelligence Community Staff, and Defense Agencies. The subcommittee has \$512.7 billion authorized in total spending for fiscal year 2009. Energy, healthcare, housing, education, and research and development funding is also included in the Defense bill.

“It is an honor and a priv-

ilege to serve on the Defense Subcommittee. I look forward to working to provide our military with the resources necessary to defend and protect our freedoms and ensure the safety and security of America’s families,” said Kilpatrick.

The Transportation Housing and Urban Development Subcommittee has jurisdiction over the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Department of Transportation, the Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board, the

Federal Maritime Commission, the National Transportation Safety Board, the Neighborhood Reinvestment Corporation, the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness, and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority. The subcommittee appropriated \$103.6 billion in total spending for fiscal year 2008.

Kilpatrick is the second African American woman to serve on the powerful House Appropriations Committee, which authorizes spending for all levels of the federal government. As a Member of the Appropriations Committee,



the Congresswoman has a vote on all 12 appropriations bills.

Born Carolyn Jean Cheeks, she graduated from the Detroit High School of Commerce. She then attended Ferris State University in Big Rapids

from 1968 to 1970 and received a B.S. from Western Michigan University (Kalamazoo) in 1972. She earned a M.S. from the University of Michigan in 1977. She worked as a high school teacher and was later a member of the Michigan State House of Representatives from 1979 to 1996.

She was married to Bernard Nathaniel Kilpatrick, with whom she has daughter Ayanna and son Kwame Kilpatrick. Kwame Kilpatrick recently resigned as Detroit's mayor following his guilty plea to two felonies for obstruction of justice.

Daphne L. Session

Daphne L. Session was sworn in as Houston County Attorney on January 1, 2009. The state of Texas is divided into 254 counties. Miss Session is one of only three black county attorneys in the history of the state of Texas and the first black female.

At 11:00 AM on January 1, 2009, the District Court Room at the Houston County Court House was

filled to capacity with Houston County Officials, their families and well wishers. It was an emotional moment for Attorney Daphne L. Session, her family and friends as the honorable Pam Foster Fletcher, Judge 349th Judicial District, administered the oath of office to Miss Session. It had been a long and difficult year and a half of endless campaigning to get to

this moment. But she was finally there and had finally opened the doorway for other African Americans by demonstrating that it could be done.

May 2006 she became the first African American to open a private practice law office in Cherokee County and Houston County and prior to that the first African American Assistant District Attorney in both Anderson County and Houston County. Daphne feels that what she has accomplished is nothing



out of the ordinary. In private practice she has taken on many challenges to defend her clients both private pay and court appoint-

ed and as a prosecutor seeing that justice was administered fairly. She understands well that the stereotypical image of an East Texas Prosecutor is not that of an African American or a woman.

Miss Session is the daughter of Rusk City Councilman Walter Session and wife Maxine Session. She was born and raised in Rusk. Daphne graduated Sam Houston State University with a Bachelor Degree in Criminal Justice and Texas Tech School of

Law with a Doctor of Jurisprudence Degree in 1999.

Other newly elected Houston County officials sworn in were Donna Kaspar, District Attorney; Pam Foster Fletcher, District Judge; Roger Dickey, Commissioner Pct. 1; Pat Perry, Commissioner Pct. 3; Darrel Bobbitt, Sheriff; Dannette Millican, Tax Assessor-Collector; Morris Luker, Commissioner Pct 1; and Kenneth “Red” Smith Constable Pct. 2.

Pat Simmons holds a B.S. in Mass Communications from Emerson College in Boston, MA. Her hobbies/interests include digging up dirt on dead people while researching her genealogy. Barack the Magic Negro

As the final days of 2008 ebb away even the wave of euphoria that swept over America following the election of Barack Obama as President could not purify the country of its embedded racism.

Opinion polls taken after the November 4 election seemed to imply that the collapsing economy had opened America's collective eyes and hearts to put aside that which divided us.

It seemed that Obama's campaign reminder to America had taken root. That America is not made up of blue states or red states, but must always be the United States. United we could come together and tackle the great challenges that we face by summoning a new spirit of patriotism; of service and responsibility where each of us resolves to pitch in and work harder and look after not only ourselves, but each other.

We watched and waited--hopeful, anxious, tearfully--as a dream that had been decades in the making began to unfold before our eyes on election night. The state by state voting results started to come in beginning on the east coast and moving west.

The suspense was short lived. A McCain victory quickly became improbable as the hope of an Obama victory gradually turned into a certainty with Obama's early wins in the Northeast, Iowa, and the critical swing states of Pennsylvania and Ohio. He also won the victories in the states of Michigan, Wisconsin, and neighboring Minnesota by double digits.

Every major American network called the election in favor of Barack Obama at 11:00 PM Eastern

Standard Time as the polls closed on the West Coast and Obama's electoral count reached the magic 270 number.

Then the reality sunk in when the man himself stepped on the stage in Chicago's historic Grant Park to the thundering cheers of 250,000 supporters; an African-American who would soon be addressed as Mr. President.

Later that night Obama picked up additional swing states that had been too close to call.

These included Florida, Indiana, Virginia, and the western states of New Mexico, Colorado, and Nevada, all states that had been carried by George Bush in 2004. Obama carried 28 states and the District of Columbia with a projected electoral vote count of 365 to McCain's 173.

Other Democrats have captured the White House in the last 40 years since Johnson. However, none has won both a majority of the votes and simultaneously a broad mandate from the states. Jimmy Carter won the popular vote impressively, but did not change the red and blue political map. Obama by contrast has unquestionably given the Democratic Party both the political legitimacy of an unchallengeable victory and the moral authority of red and blue states.

Obama, on the other hand, has won the presidency by crafting a majoritarian platform and boldly making that message acceptable in places that have rarely voted Democrat in any presidential election since Lyndon Johnson's 1964 blowout victory.

But reality dictates that the negativists throw buckets of cold water on the political fireworks of unity ignited by Obama's amaz-



ing victory. After all, racism and bigotry are still the universal weapons of America's dividers.

One such bucket is the song called "Barack the Magic Negro" recently distributed to RNC members by Chip Saltsman, who is seeking the RNC chairmanship.

The ditty, sung to the music of the "Puff, the Magic Dragon" in the sound alike voice of Rev. Al Sharpton, originated on conservative commentator Rush Limbaugh's radio program (no surprise here). When admonished by saner Republicans Mr. Saltsman responded that members of the RNC committee have "the good humor and good sense" to see the tune as "lighthearted political parodies."

While it is shocking no one should be surprised by this childish act of bigotry. The mere fact that Rush Limbaugh was involved should say a lot about the entire affair. One thing is certain; the current extremists running the Republican Party like their predecessors find racism funny. To them, bigotry is not only fun but big business. And Rush is one of the biggest.

Remember the Don Imus controversial "nappy head" joke of 2007?

America, like much of the world, faces a growing polarization of wealth that has made poverty the new and real racism. People of all colors are being left out of the opportunities for good educations, good jobs, good health, and good housing.

As poverty has spread throughout our society, there has been a steady effort to put in place a system of laws to contain this growing mass of the dispossessed. This paradigm has already made America the world's leading prison nation. This travesty supersedes the childish racism that enjoys so much media attention.

In his victory speech following the election, Barack Obama has drawn a line under the last eight dreadful years of the Bush administration that few will mourn. And whether he is magical or just a special individual whose time has come it is evident that he has taken on his shoulders the great weight of leadership that the United States of America so desperately needs.





benefactors of a stress filled environment and this makes learning even more difficult. The BE program teaches students how to focus and improve their information - processing skills to reinforce their learning.

Children are taught how to breath, focus on flexibility, and how to clear away emotional residues of earlier experiences and releases the associated energy toward new perspectives and attitude.

Brain Education started in East Asian. It has been updated and refined with critical insights from neuroscience and other disciplines. BE integrates and applies core understands about brain, mind and behavior.

Twenty students at fifth grade level participated in a pilot Brain Education

program twice weekly for twelve weeks. After completion of the program, they displayed significant improvements in five out of twelve tests of learning efficiency, including concentration, learning strategy, learning acceptability, self-control strategy, and emotional control strategy, as well as a global score of learning efficiency. In contrast, a control group of twenty students did not show improvements in any of these measures, according Korean Journal of Educational Research. 2004.

Forty pre-schoolers (age 5) participated in a Brain Education program for thirty minutes daily, for five months. Compared to a control group of 40 children, the children in the Brain Education program showed significant



improvements in six of eight different intelligences tested, including linguistic, logical-mathematical, body-kinesthetic, musical, interpersonal, and intrapersonal intelligence, according to the Journal of Brain Education.

Dr. Collins said BE is a win, win for students, teachers, principal, and parents. Children she said become more comfortable with learning and also more supportive of each other. Teachers have an easier time in the classroom and more confidence that their students are learning. Principals, she said, benefit it is easier to meet academic goals and also easier to retain teacher because they are no constantly dealing with disciplinary problems.

two terms between 1801 and 1809, was described as the "son of a half-breed Indian squaw and a Virginia mulatto father," as stated in Vaughn's findings. Jefferson also was said to have destroyed all documentation attached to his mother, even going to extremes to seize letters written by his mother to other people.

President Andrew

Jackson, the nation's seventh president, was in office between 1829 and 1837. Vaughn cites an article written in The Virginia Magazine of History that Jackson was the son of an Irish woman who married a black man. The magazine also stated that Jackson's oldest brother had been sold as a slave.

Lincoln, the nation's 16th president, served

between 1861 and 1865. Lincoln was said to have been the illegitimate son of an African man, according to Leroy's findings. Lincoln had very dark skin and coarse hair and his mother allegedly came from an Ethiopian tribe. His heritage fueled so much controversy that Lincoln was nicknamed "Abraham Africanus the First" by his opponents.

President Warren Harding, the 29th presi-

dent, in office between 1921 and 1923, apparently never denied his ancestry. According to Vaughn, William Chancellor, a professor of economics and politics at Wooster College in Ohio, wrote a book on the Harding family genealogy. Evidently, Harding had black ancestors between both sets of parents. Chancellor also said that Harding attended Iberia College, a school founded to educate fugitive

slaves.

Coolidge, the nation's 30th president, served between 1923 and 1929 and supposedly was proud of his heritage. He claimed his mother was dark because of mixed Indian ancestry. Coolidge's mother's maiden name was "Moor" and in Europe the name "Moor" was given to all blacks just as "Negro" was used in America. It later was concluded that Coolidge was part black.

The only difference between Obama and these former presidents is that none of their family histories were fully acknowledged by others. Even though Obama is half-white, he strongly resembles his Kenyan father. And not only is Obama open about his ancestry, most people acknowledge him as a black man, which is why people identify Obama as the first black president of the United States.

speech, King III, now a human rights leader in his own right, spoke from his heart as he stood before the Capitol Hill audience of hundreds, thinking of his father, who was assassinated April 4, 1968 and his mother who died of cancer on Jan. 30, 2006.

"I cannot say exactly

what my father and mother would say, but I know they're looking down on us smiling," said King, founder and president of Realizing the Dream, a non-profit advocacy organization for the poor. Then he laid out the bare facts:

"But, as long as there are 37 plus million people liv-

ing in poverty, the dream will not be fulfilled; as long as we live in a nation where 47 plus million people have no health insurance, the dream has not been fulfilled, as long as we live in a nation where the criminal justice system has millions of people and just about 50-50 percent of those people are people of color, the dream will not be fulfilled," he told the vigorously

applauding audience. "We still have work to do, but the wonderful thing is we can make it happen. Where there is great challenge, there is also great opportunity."

But, he added, "We've got to roll up our sleeves."

Had he lived, Dr. King would be 80 years old on Jan. 15 this year. Listening to King III speak were civil rights icons U. S. Rep. John Lewis (D-Ga.) and Dr.

Dorothy Height, president emeritus of the National Council of Negro Women, both of whom marched on Washington with Dr. King on Aug. 28, 1963, where he rendered the famous "I Have a Dream" speech. Both Lewis and Height received rousing applause when acknowledged by King III.

But, King pointed out that it was the principles for

which they stood that made them great. He encouraged the CBC and the audience to remember those principles as outlined succinctly by Dr. King in several of his speeches. King quoted his father, "The ultimate measure of a person is not where they stand in times of comfort and convenience, but where they stand in times of challenge and controversy."

implement and don't pass a cost/benefit test.

"The best plan for economic recovery would be giving more money back to taxpayers in the form of tax cuts, which can increase consumer spending and increase job creation," says Davis. "It will also avoid the corruption and wastefulness of government spending—something that must be addressed at once if we expect to remain a free and prosperous nation."

"Public works projects, like those proposed by the Obama administration, will take too long to implement and many will cost far more than their economic benefit," Davis explains. "So, not only will the government be spending taxpayer money on wasteful projects, it be spending money during a time when economic relief is not needed. Conversely, tax cuts are always in season."

The Libertarian Party also warns that adding

close to a trillion dollars in additional government spending to the budget will push the United States

closer to financial ruin.

"Elected officials don't like to talk about the reality of government spending

because it's not an issue that gets them reelected, especially when they will be long-gone before it comes time to pay the piper," says Davis.



Happy Birthday Dr. King!

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tennessee on April 4, 1968. He was only 39 years old.

Some Timely Quotes of Dr. King: "Let us rise up tonight with a greater readiness. Let us stand with a greater determination. And let us move on in these powerful days, these days of challenge, to make America what it ought to be. We have an opportunity to make America a better nation." "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." "We will have to repent in this generation not merely for the hateful words and actions of the bad people but for the appalling silence of the good people." "Nonviolence means avoiding not only external physical violence but also internal violence of spirit. You not only refuse to shoot a man, but you refuse to hate him." "Life's most urgent question is: What are you doing for others?" "So Let Freedom Ring..."

A humanitarian, civil rights leader, author, teacher, preacher – Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was all of these and more. Plainly put, Dr. King proudly changed the consciousness and character of America. With his urgent messages of non-violence and justice for all Americans, Dr. King reached more people than any other African-American leader in history, at the time. In 1964, he became the youngest recipient of the world renown and coveted Nobel Peace Prize.

"I Have a Dream," Dr. King's most famous speech, was delivered to more than 200,000 people at the "March on Washington" at the Lincoln Memorial. In the summer of 1963, the nation was seething with racial tension, and frequent riots were tearing apart communities. In the midst of these calamities, Dr. King conveyed his vision in a very powerful language that the world has not forgotten and probably never will forget. Dr. King's spouse, Mrs. Coretta Scott King recalled, "At that moment it seemed as if the Kingdom of God appeared; but it only lasted for a moment."

As a New Year begins, I am reminded of something that I read; it is something to ponder and to take action on as we embrace and anticipate another new page in



King's name became virtually synonymous with the civil rights movement of the late 1950's and early 1960's.

Leading the 2009 Plano community activities in celebration and commemoration of the birthday and legacy of the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is the Unity Walk for A Day of Non-Violence on Saturday, January 17. Just as Dr. King and his contemporaries united with local, state, and national diverse groups to build a coalition of trust, justice, and brotherhood, our mission on that day will be to plant another seed to help

begins at 8:00 AM. The city-wide celebration concludes with PISD's MLK tribute on January 22. This year's program, "I Am America", will salute family members who are serving or who have served in the military services. The program will be held from 7 to 8:15 p.m. in Collinwood Hall at Plano Centre, 2000 E. Spring Creek Parkway, in Plano.





