## DeSoto ISD: The makings of an M/WBE policy

The DeSoto Independent School District (DeSoto ISD or the District) is known to cast a wide net in regards to securing the "best value" for goods and services for its District. In November 2010, the District began exploring the benefits of implementing a more targeted policy approach to include the minor-

ity-women owned business enterprises (M/WBE).

The implementation of such a policy does not limit the district to only doing business with M/WBEs – companies with at least 51 percent ownership by a woman or minority. The policy mandates that entities simply take affirmative action to ensure that equal opportunity is provided in all

aspects of their purchasing and bidding opportunities.

Since 1997, DeSoto ISD has been considered a minority-majority entity. The district population is approximately 80 percent African-American; 12 percent Hispanic, 7 percent Anglo and 1 percent Asian/Pacific Islander/Native American.

Following the death of Sharon Sternes, five African

Americans (Don Grant, Kenzie Moore, Sandra Wheeler, Van Stripling and Warren Seay Jr.) and one Anglo American (Dee Trimble) currently sit on DeSoto ISD's Board of Trustees.

The district's superintendent, Lloyd Treadwell, is Anglo American and has announced his retirement effective

## Jobs returning to cities

President Barack Obama has taken a lot of flack from Republicans for his "failure" to create jobs and get millions of unemployed Americans back to work. To hear his critics tell it, the President has done little to nothing in the way of job creation. However, recent statistics from the Department of Labor paint a different picture, one that shows the President has kept his word and that, slowly but surely, Americans are finding jobs.

More than 200,000 jobs were created in February and March 2011 - the most jobs created over a two-month period since 2006. Big cities, which need jobs the most, are fairing very well. According to the Department of Labor, more than 75-percent of America's 372 cities reported lower unemployment rates in February 2011. Among those cities that saw a drop in unemployment claims are Los Angeles, New York and Miami.

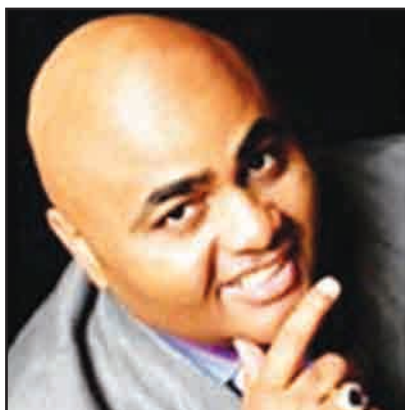

## Dr. Winslow Sargeant

Dr. Winslow Sargeant is the sixth Chief Counsel for Advocacy of the U.S. Small Business Administration's Office of Advocacy, appointed by President Obama August 19, 2010. The Office of Advocacy is an independent voice for small business within the



federal government with a mission of encouraging

policies that support small business start-up, growth, and development.

As chief counsel, Dr. Sargeant directs Advocacy's operations, which include conducting research on the U.S. small business sector, advocating for small businesses within the federal government's agencies and rulemaking processes, reaching out to regional and state small business advocates and policymakers, and fostering public awareness of small business contributions and concerns.

Dr. Sargeant sees the entrepreneurial spirit as uniquely American and as a path to wealth and job creation—a thread that runs through his life story. Most recently, he

served as managing director of Venture Investors, LLC, in Madison, Wisconsin. The firm provided seed and early-stage money to high-potential health care and IT companies. There, he specialized in computer software, hardware, and materials, and worked with technology transfer offices.

The chief counsel brings to his advocacy role years of experience as a federal partner to small firms. From 2001 to 2005, he was program manager in electronics for the National Science Foundation's Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Program, while also serving as adjunct professor at the University of Pennsylvania. The NSF is one of the federal agencies with the largest extramural research and development

budgets that are required in the SBIR program to dedicate a portion of their awards to small firms.

And Dr. Sargeant knows the challenges of starting and building a small firm. He enrolled in a PhD. Program at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, in 1988 and left in 1992 to work at IBM in Rochester, Minnesota. He received his PhD in electrical engineering in 1995, and worked at ATT/Bell Labs in Allentown, Pennsylvania. In 1997, Dr. Sargeant and partners co-founded Aanetcom, a "fabless" semiconductor integrated circuit design company. The company designed state-of-the-art computer circuits for telecom and broadband applications. In March 2000, Aanetcom was acquired by PMC-Sierra, a publicly traded company.

Dr. Sargeant met his

wife, Ikanyeng, during his graduate studies at the University of Wisconsin.

Winslow and Ikanyeng have three children, Kgosi, Lorato, and Marang.

## Manning, Malcolm and Meaning

By Julianne Malveaux (NNPA) Dr. Manning Marable made his transition a few days before his Malcolm X biography was released on April 4. The community of scholars that admired him was saddened by his death, and also anticipated the work that would be the product of his decades of research. In many ways, the product did not disappoint. Manning Marable interpreted Malcolm X through a lens that is both familiar and unfamiliar. He decoded Alex Haley's *Autobiography of Malcolm X* like a surgeon with a scalpel, finding inconsistencies, reinventions, and hard truths. At the same time there were questions that remain unanswered, suggesting that Dr. Marable, much like Brother Alex Haley, could not totally crack the code called Malcolm X.

To be sure, the detailed information about the split between the Honorable Elijah Mohammed and Malcolm X offers more transparency than has been offered heretofore. Similarly, information about the organizations Malcolm X founded, the MMI, Inc., and the Organization of African American Unity (OAAU) provides many of us with more than we knew before. At the same time, information about the environment the Nation of Islam created that encouraged the assassination of Malcolm X both reinforces and reveals. Manning Marable did his work!

Even as Manning Marable filled in some details of the Malcolm X life, he did not nor was it his intention to, minimize the meaning of the life of Malcolm X. Indeed, as he concludes the book, "A deep respect for, and a belief in, black humanity was at the heart of this revolutionary visionary's faith. And as his social vision expanded to include people of divergent nationalities and racial identities his gentle humanism and antiracism could have become a platform for a new kind of racial, global and ethnic politics." Dr. Marable goes on to say that "Malcolm X should become a representative for hope and human dignity. At least for the African American people, he has already come to embody those loftier aspirations." Realism did not trump Manning Marable's admiration for Malcolm X because he understood the complex nature of humanity, of the fact that many leaders are both fabulous and flawed.

I had not been in touch with Manning Marable for awhile, but we were friends and colleagues. I mourned his passing and devoured the Malcolm X biography in tribute to his last research. And it is important to remember Malcolm X now, as the attacks on the Africa American man escalate, as the notion of integrity is parsed. Ossie Davis described Malcolm X as "our prince", "our manhood." He lifted him up to lift us all up. And yet we

are in the middle of a season when there is little lifting up, just stomping down.

Even Ray Charles, or Jamie Foxx with his eyeballs glued, can see that there is much about the Tea Party that is race-reactive. Much as President Barack Obama has attempted to be the antithesis of Malcolm X, for many he is that black prince, that bright star revolutionary. We are in an era of backlash, backtrash, turning the clock back because the present is too uncomfortable. Even as President Obama has attempted to move us forward, guaranteeing health care, working on jobs, there are a bunch of folk who want to move us back.

And so our government was on the brink of closing. And so there are major challenges to investment in education. And so our President has been pushed up against the wall by those who want to turn the clock back, cut spending, even in a recession when spending cuts might cause us to double dip. But for those who are determined to shift the course of a river, it doesn't matter. They will take our nation down simply to get their way.

Much is made of the different approach that Malcolm X had from Dr. Martin Luther King, but the fact is that both had audacity. They made it plain, spelled it out, called our nation on its flaws. It would be simplistic to say that one did it gently and one militantly. It is perhaps more accurate to

say that each had an approach to challenging the status quo.

So I am thinking about Malcolm X because I am thinking about audacity in the cotemporary context. Where are the voices to challenge this Tea Party? Who will say that cutting things like Pell Grants is unacceptable? How will we reclaim our nation without audacious voices? Manning Marable's biography of Malcolm X reminds me of a time when social restructuring was on our collective minds. What happened to a dream deferred?

## Payday lending bills pass out of committee

*Bills do not address all concerns with payday lenders, but represent improvement from current law.*

On Thursday, April 7, the House Committee on Pensions, Investments, and Financial Services unanimously approved House Bills 2592, 2593, and 2594, by Rep. Vicki Truitt (R-Southlake). These bills create a system of regulations for payday lenders, who currently are subject to very little state oversight.

At the outset of the legislative session, State Rep. Rafael Anchia (D-Dallas) and State Rep. Marc Veasey (D-Fort Worth), who serve on the committee, had hoped for stronger regulation. Both representatives authored or co-authored bills that would have provided for more restrictions on payday lenders. Those bills would have restricted the lenders' ability to roll over past due balances into new loans, charge exorbitant interest rates, and saddled consumers with unex-

pected debt.

"This bill, although not perfect, brings significant new regulation to an industry that, until now, has been free to operate in Texas with very little oversight," Rep. Anchia said. He added, "Significantly, the Office of the Consumer Credit Commissioner now has the power to move against the bad actors in the industry on behalf of consumers who look to the state for much-needed protection from predatory lenders."

Despite their preference for stronger legislation, Rep. Anchia and Rep. Veasey voted in favor of the payday lending bills. They feel that the legislation provides as much protection and regulation as possible while ensuring that the bills can obtain



the support of the majority of the Legislature. Both representatives believe that the need for regulation of payday lending is too pressing to delay by waiting for more perfect legislation.

"Although I wish that we could pass a bill that would do more to protect consumers, I support this legislation because I believe it is the most we can accomplish this session, and it represents a significant improvement over current law," Rep. Veasey said.

tive June 2011. *The Dallas Morning News* is reporting Dallas Independent School District Trustee Lew Blackburn has completed a second interview and is expected to be announced as the "lone finalist" on Thursday.

One constant factor is that the district maintained its focus on securing the best product and price for the allotted budget without regard for utilization status.

"Our practice in the past has been to secure the 'best value' for the district in all purchasing considerations, realizing that buying from M/WBEs and/or local vendors is certainly a piece of that 'best value' consideration; consequently, purchasing decisions involve

record or request the certification status of its bidders.

If district is in compliance with the state purchasing mandate is not the real question to be answered. The Board of Trustees is actively exploring its practices to determine if the implementation of an M/WBE policy is truly right for this district due to its current purchasing practices.

The Texas Association for School Boards policy for purchasing and vendor acquisition (CH LOCAL) does not mandate the inclusion of a M/WBE policy. According to the TASB policy, "All district contracts, except contracts for the purchase of produce or vehicle fuel, valued at

currently uses multiple purchasing vendors and cooperative outlets in an effort to effectively utilize its spending budget.

"As a publicly held organization, we owe our taxpayers to acquire the best products at the best prices. Our purchasing department uses all the tools at its disposal to include all vendors and entities interested in bidding on district needs. DeSoto ISD does a very high percentage of its purchasing through purchasing cooperatives; M/WBE status information may or may not be available from these cooperatives. We'll obviously be researching and answering these questions as we develop and implement an M/WBE policy. At the same time, DeSoto ISD works to utilize local vendors when possible as well."

Specifically, the district is a part of about nine purchasing cooperative organizations including Region 18 Purchasing Cooperative, TASB Buyboard, U.S. Communities and U.S. General Services Administration (two nationwide purchasing cooperatives), and the Educational Purchasing Cooperative of North Texas. This gives the district instant access to thousands of vendors. Additionally, the district still locally advertise its bids and RFPs as it is required under the state law.

"DeSoto ISD advertises all local bids in the *Daily Commercial Record*, generally accepted as the leading legal publication/newspaper for Dallas County. For those local bids that specifically target local vendors,

we also advertise in the *DeSoto Focus* and/or other local newspapers," said Beth Trimble, DeSoto ISD director of communications.

In an effort to answer the question whether an M/WBE policy should exist, the board and purchasing department are seeking to gather data on its current renewing vendors.

"The district has been very excited to develop an M/WBE policy and thus hired a consultant that has worked with other area districts to assure the best policy can be put into place for the benefit of the district," Trimble said.

Asked if there were any known issues regarding the change in method, Trimble said she does not anticipate an internal or external resistance to the development of a target policy.

"We primarily hope to expand our purchasing efficiency and effectiveness by increasing the number of vendors available."

The most current efforts to preclude the interest or need for such a policy proved a positive interest from area firms and vendors that attended the pre-bid conferences held during the development of the High School Academy Phase II bond project proposal.

"We had an overwhelming response to two pre-bid information meetings specifically aimed at informing local and area M/WBE vendors which included contact with various construction associations. More than 180 individuals attended those two sessions to learn about the scope of

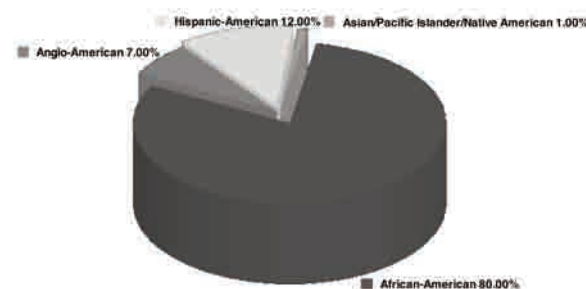

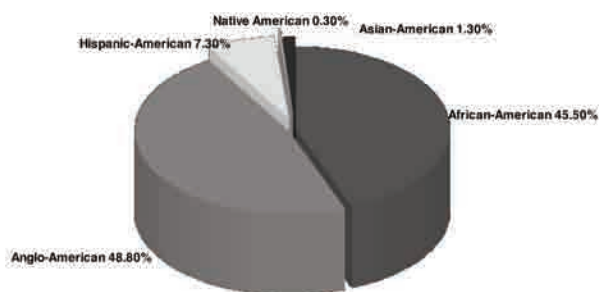

The agreement with Wells Fargo and NAACP was initiated last year and through this partnership, Wells Fargo became the first bank to endorse the NAACP's Responsible Mortgage Lending Principles. The agreement also includes a process for sharing data, assessing Wells Fargo's lending and servicing practices, and a shared accountability for progress.

The NAACP Financial Freedom Center will provide workshops on topics such as money management and home preservation through partnerships with community groups in the

D.C. area. The Financial Freedom Center will serve as a base for NAACP units across the country to learn and organize around financial and economic empowerment. It will also hold gatherings to educate leaders in the financial industry about the historical impact of racial discrimination and best practices in achieving racial equity.

The Financial Freedom Center will be staffed by a team of NAACP professionals. Volunteers from nonprofit organizations, financial institutions such as Wells Fargo, and others will be on site at the Center and across the country to provide guidance in such areas

as home preservation, attaining a mortgage, credit repair and more.

"We applaud Wells Fargo for agreeing to increase financial education and wealth building opportunities tailored to communities of color," stated NAACP Chairman Roslyn Brock. "This partnership will increase awareness and assist minority consumers in making informed decisions regarding financial products and services."

for employees who opt to attend college upon completion of the program. The program will be designed to allow candidates to experience in a number of field and technical positions within Atmos Energy's Dallas Service Center.

The program is multi-tier model designed to help successful new hires learn core business practices and skills. Each tier will consist of a specified period of time in a targeted job field. At the com-

pletion of each tier, Atmos will evaluate the candidates. Exemplary performance will permit the candidate to move to the next tier. Candidates who do not meet evaluation requirements will be released from the program. At completion of the three tiers, a final evaluation is completed.

Candidates with exemplary performance may be offered the following two options: one, candidates who consistently participate in the

education assistance program and achieve 15 credit hours of courses with a grade of C or better at the completion of the two-year multi-tier program will be eligible to pursue school full-time at their discretion. Atmos will offer the candidate up to \$2,000 for a scholarship, payable to the college or university of the candidate's choice. This option will terminate employment at Atmos. Two, candidate may continue employ-

ment with Atmos at regular full-time hours and will be eligible for benefits.

New hires will earn \$11.50 an hour for approximately the first 15 months from hire or the first full year review cycle to stay in alignment with Atmos Energy's annual review period. After the review period and depending upon their level of performance they will be compensated for their work and eligible for full-time pay.

municipal government will provide the critical foundation for success as mayor.

## What are your top three (3) priorities in this elective office?

**1. Public Safety** I think public safety is still the basis for improvement on other fronts. We must insure people feel safe in their homes, when they are out shopping or taking their kids to the park. Our businesses must feel it is safe to open their doors or expand their business. You can't have a great city if you don't have a safe city. My tenure as Police Chief proved I am the candidate to protect Dallas residents

**2. Revitalize neighborhoods and get back to basics** My motto in this campaign has been: We are overtaxed and underserved. The benefits of big-ticket projects are not flowing back to Dallas residents. The city must shift its focus away from grand projects and back to restoring and building our neighborhoods. The City of Dallas needs to work best for the residents who choose to live here. If we improve the quality of life for our citizens and create a city that residents are proud of, then business will come and prosperity will follow.

**3. Economic growth** We must create an economic environment that attracts small businesses as well as large employers because small businesses create hundreds of new jobs. We need to attract business to the southern sector of the city where opportunities for growth and employees are abundant. I believe in organic growth. Bishop Arts and North Oak Cliff are examples that I hope to see duplicated across the city. Small business owners partnered with community involvement to create an exciting and unique place to be. Dallas must also embrace quality development that allows for greater density and growth of the tax base. This is not in just large projects, but can be a larger office development or revitalized shopping centers. The city's develop-

ment code must be flexible enough to allow for this transition. Rather than simply pockets of prosperity in Dallas, we must strive for nodes of activity in all neighborhoods.

**If successful, what would you do to improve this office?** I believe we can reduce the size of government without cutting basic services and without raising taxes. I believe for long-term growth to occur we must start at the neighborhood level and focus on the basics. The city must work best for the people who live here. I am the only candidate talking about how our city can not only survive, but thrive by building strong neighborhoods. Building more roads to move people out of the city will not help our city grow. Our budget problems are more systemic than just a bad economy and I am the only candidate with a plan to re-invent government. I have a proven track record of turning around organizations in turmoil, not just in Dallas, but in every organization I have led.

**How would you relate the problems/progress of this public office?** The benefits of big-ticket projects are not flowing back to Dallas residents. The city must shift its focus away from grand projects and back to restoring and building our neighborhoods. Local government has the greatest impact on individual lives and this comes across each time a citizen goes out of their home. The only big projects that the city should examine in these times are those that impact the long term viability of our city, such as water, sanitation and the quality of our streets, sewer, and water lines.

The latest census should be a huge wake-up call for all of us. North Texas is the fastest growing region in the country, yet the City of Dallas only increased by 9,000 residents. I call this the 'donut-hole effect'.

All around us good things are happening, but our city has not maximized that prosperity. Yet the only

answers I hear are the same we have heard before; attract big business, offer big tax incentives, build big projects, etc. Interestingly, despite these strategies Dallas is losing out on projects to highly competitive and well-staffed suburban cities that show mastery of basic city services.

The City of Dallas needs to work best for the residents who live here. We must concentrate on building and improving our neighborhoods. When neighborhoods are clean, safe, livable, close to parks and recreation, near stores and amenities, people will want to live here. Let's rebuild from the bottom up not the top down. Let's encourage businesses that relocate here to live in our neighborhoods too, and not take the first highway out of town at the end of the day. The city of Dallas must make DART into a daily asset and not simply an occasional convenience. The investment is tremendous and only by increasing density with quality will DART become a jewel that empowers the central city.

**What do citizens deserve from this public office?** The citizens deserve a mayor who stands for them, that puts the emphasis on their street, on their neighborhood, on their community. I have experience working with every neighborhood in Dallas. I know the issues first hand and have direct relationships with Dallas residents throughout the city and in every community. I have a proven record of bringing groups and people together. I believe I can work well with the council and staff to bring needed change to Dallas. As police chief you deal with many different constituencies and you must bring them all together. A Dallas Police Chief balances seven police unions, community groups, the mayor and council and dozens of media outlets always scrutinizing your actions. The job of major City Police Chief is perhaps one of the most difficult jobs in the country. I am a good lis-

tener, but also a good persuader. I will bring those skills to the horseshoe as mayor.

**How does your character, work ethic or expertise match citizen needs and expectations?** When I

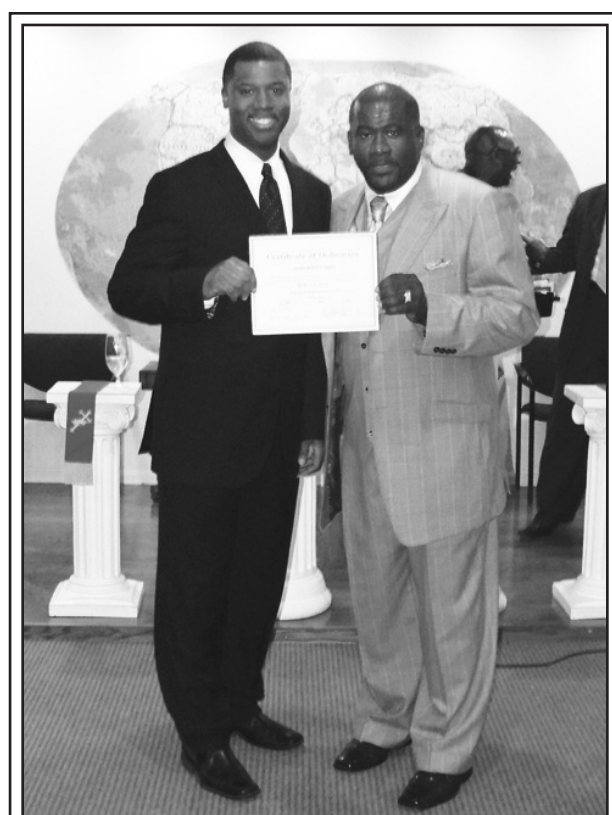

A recent press release from the U.S. Census Bureau reported between 2000 and 2010, Texas joined California, the District of Columbia, Hawaii and New Mexico in having a "majority-minority" population, where more than 50 percent of the population was part of a minority group. According to U.S. Census Tract 2000, the City of Dallas has over a 50 percent minority population (see graph).

Since the human landscape of Dallas has changed, the mayoral candidates recognize they must be able to relate and understand the issues facing the minority communities. Candidates Mike Rawlings (former businessman and Homeless Czar for the City and current Dallas Park and Recreation Board President), Edward Okpa, III (real estate consultant and serving on the Dallas Development Fund), Ron Natinsky (Dallas City Councilman for District 12 and Chair of Dallas City Council's Economic Development Committee), and David Kunkle (former Dallas Police Chief) are all vying for the minority vote.

All four candidates have been hitting the campaign trail in the hopes of convincing voters they are the best candidate to address the major issues facing our City. But the question that still remains, are citizens in the minority communities buying their campaign promises?

Recently, three of the four mayoral candidates attended a forum hosted by the Park Cities/Central Dallas Democrats held at the Oaklawn Public Library. Former Dallas Police Chief, David Kunkle was not present due to having a conflict in schedule according to his proxy, Honorable Harryette Ehrhardt and former Texas State Representative.

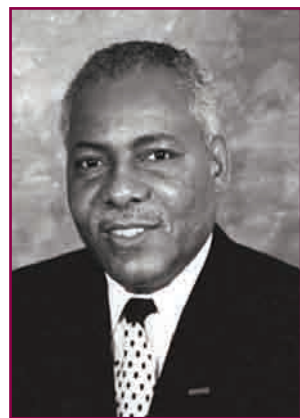
One issue that has become a talking point among

candidates at these forums is the overwhelming disproportion of City funding in the southern sector, better known as the North-South Divide.

During the forum Rawlings adds, "Everybody wants the same thing strong, clean neighborhoods and access to things that give them opportunity and it is through economic development that we are going to have the money to make this City accessible for every citizen. Economics is the lungs of the City and we must bring in that oxygen for everyone. We must have a customer-service leader to make sure that oxygen flows in all parts of the neighborhoods."

Okpa also expressed the need to focus on business opportunities in the southern areas of the City. During the forum, Okpa spoke on his campaign platform of "No Neighborhood Left Behind."

"The southern sector is devoid of the most basic amenities, it is a 'must' action to bring that sector into the fold and enhance the overall city tax base. No doubt some sectors/pockets in the northern sector need revamping but the greatest opportunity is south of the Trinity," Okpa explains in a written statement.

A respectable business leader like Ronald Hay, Chairman of the Dallas Black Chamber of Commerce and founder of ALL Temps 1 Personnel, knows the potential for economic

success in the Southern sector, but feels until city officials put actions to words and commit to investing in the economic development for the Southern sector than there will be no real change on this issue.

"There are reports that show 80 percent of the tax base from the City of Dallas comes from North Dallas, so consequently a majority of the efforts are focused on North Dallas. The problem I have is if there were more effort made to truly develop South Dallas than that tax base would swing and depending on the swing of that tax base it would become more balance, but if you leave South Dallas underdeveloped there is no way it can generate the same type of tax base as in the Northern sectors," states Hay.

"We need to attract business to the southern sector of the city where opportunities for growth and employees are abundant. I believe in organic growth. Bishop Arts and North Oak Cliff are examples that I hope to see duplicated across the city," adds Kunkle in a written response.

In a January budget briefing with the City Council, Dallas City Manager Mary Suhm advised the City could face a budget shortfall of \$41 to 96 million. According to The Texas Tribune, a non-profit news organization in Austin devoted to state government and public policy, the State faces a budget shortfall exceeding \$27 billion.

"Cuts will be made of programs and services that are duplicated and considered wasteful. But before any cut, I will inform and educate the citizens as to why the cuts must be made. And it must be done in such a way so it is not seen as favoring some and denying others" Okpa explains.

"As Mayor I will work aggressively to roll back last year's tax increase. I will use my business and civic experience to identify

ways for the City to operate more efficiently so we can provide high-quality, basic services to residents at a reduced cost," advises Natinsky.

Rawlings believes the key is to use this economic downturn as an opportunity to re-engineer city government to make it smaller and more efficient. He recommends establishing budget priorities that are funded before dollars go to non-essentials.

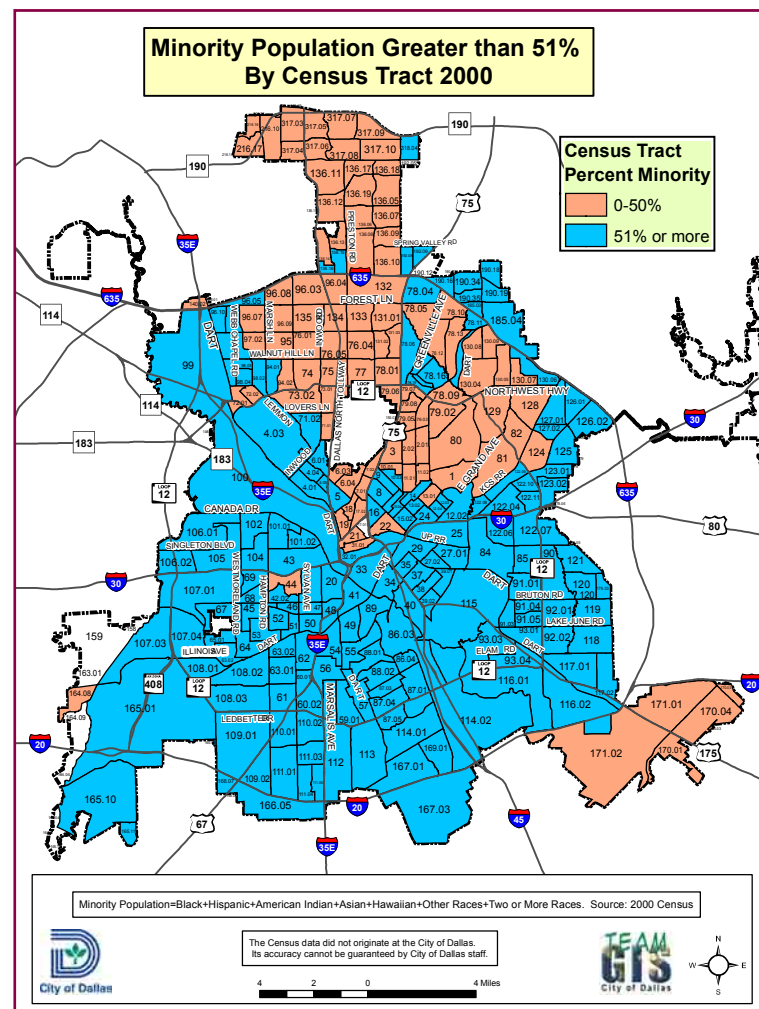
The issue with the levees alongside the Trinity River is another issue that if not addressed could have an enormous impact on minorities. The Army Corps of Engineers rated the integrity of the levees unacceptable meaning the levees cannot handle the level of flooding they were originally designed to hold back, thus the fear of having a situation similar to Hurricane Katrina is a looming issue the new Mayor must face.

FEMA has given the City a deadline of December 2011 to resolve the matter or the areas where the levee problems exist will be deemed flood plains mandating homeowners with federally backed mortgages on structures that are drawn into the flood plain to carry flood insurance, which could ultimately be a requirement affecting many minorities. Neighborhoods like Cadillac Heights, a predominately Hispanic and African American community, is one of the neighborhoods apart of the Army

Corp of Engineers Dallas Floodway Extension Project to provide overbank flowage capacity for flood waters along the west side of the Trinity River from the Dallas Floodway to

potentially loose several programs that so often are needed and important to their overall academic success.

Rawlings has publicly vowed his promise to use

"Our first priority as a city must be to not only upgrade the levees but also to build new levees (the Dallas Floodway Extension) to protect the citizens, neighborhoods and businesses in the flood plain. This is an urgent need; the entire Council understands that, and this issue will stay top of everyone's mind until it is completed," explains Natinsky in a written statement.

Education and public safety are other issues important to many minorities. Recent local news reports have reported Dallas Independent School Districts (DISD) will have to make massive budget cuts. Schools housed within minority communities could

the Mayor's office as a bully pulpit to raise awareness and launch and execute a public-private partnership to improve the City's public schools.

On public safety, Kunkle stands on his accomplishments as Dallas Police Chief, pointing out six consecutive years of total crime reduction, as well as a 32 percent decrease in violent crimes during his tenure.

The economy is the encompassing concern shared among all Dallas residents. Many residents would agree when the economy is strong, schools are stronger, crime is lower and the overall quality of life is better. However, where Dallas residents tend to differ is whose the right candidate capable of doing the job.




