This "other America" that exists in the unbridgeable charm between the haves alled chasm between the haves and the have-nots and has been deliberately hidden from public

siderable research about school populations, Kozol has comfirmed that our schools are more segregated now than in test or in many cases cooked sourcest following Brown v.Board of Education. In cities like Houston, Baltimore, Washington, D.C., Detroit, and Chicago, fewer than 10 percent of public school students are white.

Freakonomiscs, however, there's been ne media firestorm demanding an apology from him. We must drevelop to a point where we can think rationally about the osues affecting us as a race of people. Without emotion-whether we like the facts or not, whether we like the facts or not.

Our opinions become easily marginalized by the mainstream when they are purely emotional develop and mentor our youth to change statistics. Only them, can we start taking hard looks at the faults within ourselves and focus on what we can do no advance our race.





Emergency Management Agency has gone to minority businesses, less than a third of the 5 percent normally required. On Tuesday, Sen. Olympia J. Snowe, R-Maine, and Rep. Donald A. The Department of Homeland Security, whose FEMA division handles most of the contracts, said it is committed to hiring smaller, disadvuntaged firms. But many of the notaged firms. But many of the no-bid awards were given out to known players who could quick-ly provide help in an emergency situation, spokesman Larry Orluskie said.




