Bush Asks Congress To Renew Voting Rights Act

While honoring civil rights hero Rosa Parks, President Bush on Thursday delighted modern-

President Bush on Thursday delighted modernday black leaders by calling on Congress to renew the provisions of the landmark 1965 Voting Rights Act that are set to expire.

On the 50th anniversary of Parles' refusal to give up to a white man her seat on a bus in Montgomery, Ala, Bush signed into law a bill directing that a statue of Parles go up in the Capitol's Satuary Hall, Parles, who died Ort. 24 at age 92, will be the first black woman represented in Statuary Hall, where many states have satures honoring notable people in their history.

Bush credited Parles for helping to "set in motion a national movement for equality and freedom."

"Eventually the civil rights movement would succeed in persuading Congress to pass more sweeping legislation that dealt with voting rights and discrimination in public places, and school segregation," said the president. "And the United States Congress should renew the Voting Rights Act of 1965."



know very angry by uttering
what they feel is a completely radical statement: Stanley Tookie Williams is not a hero.

Neither is R. Kelly, Irv Gotti", or O.J. Simpson. When I make these stateents, the enlightened black folks I know get indignant and accuse me of not recognizing the genocidal institutionalized racism against the black male by the criminal justice system. Others simply tell me that I am not down for "the cause", or even worse, that I'm becoming Republican in my views.

Republican in my stews.

Their problem with my opinion is centered on them refusing to take an objective, informed view of the facts.

Stanley Tookie Williams was convicted and sentenced to death for the 1979 slavings of Albert Owens, Yen-I Yang, his wife, Tsai-Shai Chen Yang, and their daughter, Yu-Chin Yang Lin. Without clemency from California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, Stanley Schwarzenegger, Stanley Williams will be executed on December 13th by lethal injec-

Oh, and by the way, did I mention that Stanley Williams is the co-founder of the Crips

oxx, Snoop Dogg and Danny Glover to NAACP President Bruce Gordon have protested for elemency for Williams. Their premise is that "Tookie" Williams is no longer a violent predator, and that he has worked diligently from prison to discourage young black men

Nationwide, there are 2,848 death row inmates, half of them minorities. Whites constitute 50%, Blacks 40%, Hispanic 7% and 3% other races 80% of the Federal death row population is either black or Hispanic. In September, Frances Newton, (a black woman) became the first woman put to death in Texas since the Civil War. Why aren't these high profile protestors or the front line for the execution of every black person on death row in this country? What gives Stanley Williams more value than Frances Newton or others like

As a people, we have become enamored with criminals. We believed that O.J. did it, but we celebrated his triumph over the racist judicial system. The same dynamic is happening with black opinion in the R. Kelly case. In our contempt for the system, we have become desensitized to the crimes that

Rap music, television and movies push images that glamor-ize "thug life", to the point that we glorify gangsters. How else de in a recent Esquire magazine article, NBA player Carmelo Anthony is shown in the office of his mansion in front of pictures of Al Capone and John Gotti? Would Snopp Dogg describe Williams as "an inspirer" if Williams as "an inspirer" if Williams wasn't affiliated with

I am not advocating the death penalty for "Tookie" Williams. As Tupac Shakur said in paraphrasing the bible, only God can judge

him. However, in the rush to make a hero out of William is crucial that we not love sight of the destruction in black communities caused by him and the organization he creat-

According to retired Los Angeles County Sheriff's Sgr and gang expert Wes McBride there are now some 200 Crip area. Hundreds of people, mostly young black men, are killed each year in California

by gangs.
"There's not a whole lot of teryear, only there's more of them," McBride said. "They are more involved in narcotics trafficking than they used to be, but Crips will do whatever they can to make money. Bank robberies, armored car rob-
