### Black and White views converge on interracial marriage

(NNPA) I've long believed a succinct modern definition of marriage can be found in America's Declaration of Independence: as "the pursuit of Happiness."

In that sense, then, it's no coincidence that the phrase comes at the end of the document's famous assertion: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." – connecting a time-honored human rite to the conventionally-accepted human right of freedom.

Nowhere, in the American



context, has that link between the rite and the right been more apparent than in society's stance toward marriage between Blacks and Whites. And no more so than today, when intermarriage between Americans of different racial and ethnic backgrounds is more common than ever; and same-sex marriage has made historic breakthroughs in acceptance; and the nation's first Black

# MY RIDE Dallas shares transportation resources for seniors and disabled Dallas County residents

Transportation is the link that allows people to stay connected to their communities and live independently in their homes. Without access to transportation, people go without medical care, groceries, banking services, social and religious activities.

Nationally, it's estimated



that more than one in five seniors do not drive; half of these seniors stay home on any given day because they lack transportation. More than half of Dallas County AARP members say it would be difficult for them to get around the community if they no longer drive. Public transportation is not an option in about half of Dallas County cities.

Whether the person, family members/caregivers, physician, or the Texas Department of Public Safety make the decision that one can no longer drive safely, the decision is emotional and tough for everyone involved.

The number one reason

As President Barack Obama continues his visits to different parts of America to discuss the economy. This is his attempt to use the Bully Pulpit of the Presidency to direct a national dialogue. The President said, "There are no simple tricks to grow the economy. What we need is a serious, steady, long-term American strategy that reverses the long erosion of middle-class security and gives everyone a fair shot to get ahead."

On this score, the President is exactly right. Clearly, we have a huge jobs deficit, but the problems facing America run deeper. We are stuck because we lost the road map. Simply getting the engine of job growth running is not going to put us on the correct path. In fact, it will simply run us into another, deeper rut. The current Washington consensus that everything is fine, we just need to address long run fiscal deficits misses the pre-

carious position we are in and that we are lost.

In Chattanooga, President Obama raised two points directly that underscore the direction the national discussion needs to go. One is the issue of the minimum wage. The other was the awful track record of public-sector employment that has weakened the recovery from the Great Recession. Both relate to restoring the role of government and democracy in shaping our economy.

Once again, President Obama spoke to raising the minimum wage; a topic he mentioned in his State of the Union address. As he pointed out this week. "No one who works full-time in America should have to live in poverty, I will keep making the case that we need to raise a minimum wage that in real terms is lower than it was when Ronald Reagan took office."

To put that in a different way, we are currently paying workers wages that would have been illegal in 1980. To create the middle class out of the depths of the Great Depression, it was clear the government had to rewrite the rules of the game. The government had to reset the boundaries of economic activity, especially to set the boundaries for wages.

It follows absolutely that if it is legal to pay workers a wage that puts them in poverty, you will have poor people. It is neither in the power of workers, or the government, to fight poverty that the market generates. The growth of the middle class was achieved in the post World War II era, in large part, because until 1981, the minimum wage generally tracked closely the wage that yielded an income slightly higher than the poverty level. So, anyone who landed a job, and worked hard could at least start from being on the poverty floor. Today, that is not the case. Nearly 3 million people in America work hard full-time, year-round, but remain in the cellar, not even able to reach the floor of poverty.

The change in the 1980s was a change in policy priority. Instead of the government market would generate mid-

setting boundaries so the "Job Creator" myth. For the many workers who walked

dle-class outcomes, the government became the servant of the great "Job Creator"; a mythical beast that claimed powers impossible in economics. Modern economists believe that we observe the intersection of supply and demand forces; clearly outcomes cannot be generated simply by one force. This superstition has led to the "creation" of lots of low-wage jobs, despite a workforce that has grown in education and skills.

It is time to assert a positive role of the government in the economy. Letting market power reign is not the same as letting competition reign. Boundaries do not prevent competition; they merely proscribe the competitive outcome. The wielding of market power leads to the end of competition and the start of oligopolies and monopolies; and oligopolies and monopolies do not lead to efficient outcomes. This is why anti-trust laws were developed to counterbalance the powers of a few economic actors to dictate market outcomes; instead of market

And, something the President said only obliquely is an important set of rules the government put in place as well. The president said, "We saved the auto industry, and thanks to General Motors and the UAW working together to bring jobs back to America, 1,800 autoworkers in Spring Hill are on the job today in what was a onceclosed plant."

The importance of the UAW to saving the auto industry is a key to understanding the shortcomings of the out in collective action at fast-food restaurants around America this week to demand a raise in the minimum wage, the need for labor law change is clear. Government is one counterbalance to market power, but empowering workers is another way to bring equilibrium in the market place.

The Senate finally confirmed the president's nominees to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) so the rights of those fast-food workers can be protected and upheld. But, the president needs to articulate a modernization of enforcement of workers' rights to get us back from being lost to found.

And, in asserting a positive role for the government in the economy, the president raised the point, "Over the past four years, more than 700,000 workers at the federal, state, and local levels of government have lost their jobs. These are cops, and firefighters, and about half of them are the people who work in our kids' schools. These are real jobs, too. It doesn't help a company like Amazon when hundreds of thousands of customers have less money to spend. If those layoffs hadn't happened-if public-sector employment grew like it did after the past two recessions-the unemployment rate would be more than a full percent lower today, at 6.5%. And our economy would be much better off." The key acknowledgement he made is that "cops, and firefighters" are "real jobs, too."

Public-sector jobs are the result of democratic forcespeople demand a public good

and government has to go out to hire people to deliver those goods. The market place runs on one dollar one vote. But, public demand is based on one person, one vote. The great fear of the rich in an unequal society is that the 99 percent will exercise their democratic voice to demand public goods-public safety, public roads and public education. Suddenly, what is produced in the country, and therefore the real priorities of the country, would reflect the democratic will of the people, and not just the dictates of the rich who hold the sway in what the market will produce. And in this economy, people want to know why we can't produce jobs that pay decent wages over an economy that produces profits for companies like Apple and GE that send their money overseas to hide their profits?

The president continues to move the nation to a discussion of what it will take to re-create the middle class in America. The initial reaction from Republicans was to continue to argue about long run fiscal stability; a smoke screen for a "stay the course" strategy of slow job growth and increasing inequality and ignoring the harm done to the middle class. If the president will stick to the conversation America's workers want to hear, he can unite us in a conversation about pulling America back together. He should not get distracted by a clamor for "bipartisanship."

He needs to unite America's working families, employed and people without jobs, young and needing work and old and seeking retirement security-not uniting phony party labels. That is his job; to heal the wounds of this downturn and get us back on a path to prosperity for all. Let the Republicans alone to fight for the lost cause

### **Back to School medicine tips**

Summer is almost over and school will soon be back in session. A little extra planning is required for children who take medications during the day. Every year the Texas Poison Center Network receives calls from schools and daycare centers about medication being found on floors, in diaper bags, in backpacks or being shared among students.

Specialists with the Texas Poison Center Network, say "Parents need to make sure they're following school district policies before sending their kids off to class carrying any type of medication." It is also important to talk with your child about how dangerous these medications are, even if they are sold over the counter. Explain to children that even though medications may make one child



feel better, they can make another child very ill, so medications should never be shared with friends.

Back to school medication safety tips also include:

- · Always keep medications in their original container and don't mix several different medications into one container
- Be familiar with the school's medication policy. Most districts require all

medications to be distributed by authorized school personnel. Most policies are going to have you bring the medications to the school nurse and let them distribute the medications. Sending the medication in your child's backpack is not a good idea.

· Sports bags may contain asthma inhalers, which should never be shared with other people.



caregivers miss work is to drive someone somewhere (The MetLife Caregiving Cost Study). Daughters and sons acknowledge it's challenging to work, meet their parents' needs and take care of the kids. Often, older relatives hesitate to ask for help.

MY RIDE Dallas, www. myridedallas.org provides free in person, online and printed resources that help seniors, persons with disabilities and their caregivers find transportation options. The Get a Ride Guide, available in both English and Spanish (in print and online), lists existing transportation options in Dallas County. The web site provides useful information and contact information for a personal navigator who can discuss options, point persons and caregivers toward mobility training and advise on budgeting. To reach the MY RIDE navigator in English or Spanish, call 972-855-8084.

Since MY RIDE Dallas began in 2009 as the Community Transportation Network, it has helped more than 10,000 persons connect to transportation. Founded by the Community Council of Greater Dallas and the Dallas Area Agency on Aging, its 90 partners include public and private transportation services, human services organizations, faith-based groups and volunteer driver transportation resources.



a person may register for an upcoming regular board meeting or an upcoming board briefing is the next regular business day following the posting of that meeting. No registrations shall be accepted after 5 p.m. the day

preceding the meeting. Only those who are properly registered may address the board.

Copies of any documents for the board are to be handed to the executive director of Board Services at that time

Only one person may approach the microphone and only the person at the microphone will be allowed to speak, with the exception of interpreters. There will be no substitution of speak-

Residents and visitors who have signed up to address the board are allotted three minutes to speak. Those who continue speaking after three minutes will be warned by the executive director (through the sounding of a tone) that their time is up.

Upon expiration of the time limit, the resident or visitor is expected to stop speaking and either return to his or her seat or leave the auditorium or district property.

Groups consisting of two or more people shall appoint one person to pre-sent their views before the board.

president is the child of an interracial marriage.

That's why the finding of a just-released Gallup survey that Black Americans and White Americans are approaching a point of unanimous tolerance about Black-White intermarriage is so important: Because the fact that 96 percent of Blacks and 84 percent of Whites express approval of intermarriage – an average of 87 percent - indicates a great deal about America's present and future.

We know about the past of Black-White intermarriage in America. Whites, driven by crackpot assertions of racial purity and the "practical" necessities of slavery, banned it by law during the slave and Jim Crow eras. Not until California's Supreme Court struck down that state's law in 1948 – when a total of 24 other states had such laws and state and federal courts routinely dismissed challenges to them - did the racist restriction of the rite begin to lose power.

The Supreme Court's famous 1967 decision in Loving v. Virginia invalidated the intermarriage bans in the last 16 backward states. But even so, Whites' attitudes toward intermarriage remained mired in the

A 1969 Gallup survey found that while more than 1 of every 2 Blacks expressed approval of intermarriage, less than 1 in 5 of Whites did. By 1983, Black approval was at 71 percent; White approval at 38 percent. Not until 1997 did White approval pass the 60 percent mark; and not until 2005, when Black approval was at 87 percent, did White approval break 70 percent.

The current valuable Gallup survey, conducted over four weeks from early June to early July, just presents the data. It wasn't designed to explore the reasons behind the rise in toler-

But of course doing so is imperative.

One source of the progress is obvious: The landmark immigration act Congress passed in 1965, four months after the Voting Rights Act, produced a huge wave of immigrants of color from Asia, Latin America, and to a lesser extent, Black African nations that sharply increased the number of Americans who are people of color.

That first wave of new Americans had by the 1980s married (largely among themselves) and birthed a sizable second-generation – their children - who grew up thoroughly Americanized. In numerical terms it's the marriage record of that generation and Americans who've married in the last decade that have made intermarriage a common fact of American life.

Now, one in seven American marriages are between people of different racial or ethnic backgrounds - and together White-Hispanic American and White-Asian American marriages account for more than half of them.

The 558,000 married couples in which one spouse is Black and the other White make up only about 11 percent of all intermarriages and less than 1 percent of all married couples in America.

Those two facts underscore the central role Black-White intermarriage continues to have: as a source of inspiration to the acceptance of intermarriage in a broader sense; and specifically to the fight for same-sex marriage; and, finally, as lighting-

rod for the continuing racist sentiment in American society.

The Gallup survey findings are not a recommendation for thinking those attitudes have completely disappeared. The virulent slurs against President Obama's parents and him as their child testify to its continued grip on the diseased minds of some Americans, including

some in high places. So does the stunning explosion of racist tweets against the now-famous Cheerios interracial advertisement of late May.

But it's equally important to note that while the racist tweets initially had the element of surprise on their side, the huge outpouring of support for the ad from the decent denizens of the

Twitter-verse conveyed the same message as the Gallup survey's data: the overwhelming majority of Americans accept that this human rite is a human





## **Humanizing the Trinity River Corridor Project**

Life for 60-something Lena Perez has been pretty routine. For more than 40 vears. Perez has lived in the same neighborhood in West Dallas and she can't imagine living anywhere else.

In fact, says Perez, she and her husband Angel have raised three children in the neighborhood. And now, they take care of her grandkids. But the city's Trinity River Corridor Project could turn their lives upside down, says Perez.

The reason: the project is being developed just a few streets over from their home. And, Perez says, investors are already trying to buy out her neighbors.

"It's scary because of the fact that we're older and we don't know how to handle a situation like this. If this had happened when we were in our 20s, it would've been a lot easier," Perez says. "We need help and advice ... about what to do."

Perez says her husband Angel has been attending the local neighborhood meetings sponsored by the city about the project. But, she says, the meetings aren't helpful.

"He's (my husband) left the meetings with a lot of questions," she says, adding that it would be easier if the city was honest and open with area residents about the project.

### Project at a glance

The Trinity River Corridor Project will create a 20-mile corridor and 10,000-acre public space through the city's core, which will span seven city districts, including West Dallas (now District 6).

The project's Balanced Vision Plan purports to address the areas of: flood protection; transportation; environmental restoration and management; and parks and recreation.

Last week, the city began work on a new plan called the Connected City Design Challenge (connectedcitydesign.com), which will update or replace the Balanced Vision

Dallas City Councilwoman Monica Alonzo – who is now represents District 6, which includes West Dallas – did not return calls by press time.

The targeted area in the West Dallas community includes two side-by-side neighborhoods: La Bajada (the closest area to the Trinity River) and Los Altos.

Planning for the project has been in the works for many, many years. Voters approved \$246 million for improvements to the Trinity River in a 1998 bond election. These improvements include the development of hundreds of miles of a walking and biking trail network to connect several major parks around

garet Hunt Hill Bridge that opened in March 2012.

It is hoped, say city officials, that these improvements will spur more urban revitalization to the West Dallas neighborhood, through housing in-fill and mixed-use development. In fact, District 1 City Councilman Scott Griggs says restoration of the street grid and new residential projects are on the radar in an area south of Singleton Boulevard, between Beckley and Sylvan Roads.

But encouraging urban revitalization in an existing neighborhood, says Perez, may mean that current homeowners will be forced to sell their homes as investors seek to move in.


Of course, not all area residents and business owners see this as a bad thing.

Aaron Odom Jr., a member of the family that owns West Dallas-based Odom's BBQ, says he's excited about the incoming economic development. His family's business owns a chain of barbeque restaurants, one of which sits on Singleton Boulevard which borders both neighbor-

Dallas to the city's core; the conversion of the historic Continental Bridge to a pedestrian only bridge (already underway) and Calatrava-designed bridges like the 1,870-foot-long Mar-

Odom says the new Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge, which sits at the mouth of Singleton Boulevard as a gateway to the West Dallas neighborhood from downtown has increased area traffic.



"We like the bridge. It brought the guy doing all the investing in the area and actually, that's helping out our business," Odom says. "There are a lot of people offering to buy out the area and people are willing to invest in it...."

Edward Hadnot, who lives in the Los Altos neighborhood adjacent to Perez's, says he's happy that the city has turned its attention to a part of the city that has been neglected for so many years. Still, he agrees with Perez, that the city hasn't been as honest with area residents as it could be as to the fate of their homes.

"I think it's good for the area; it's bringing back some economic development out there to make the community better, although I don't know what impact that will have on me. I think the city could do a better job of doing that," Hadnot says.

### City level feedback

Aldo Fritz, chief planner in the City of Dallas' neighborhood and planning division concedes that the displacement of some neighborhood residents could happen as property taxes slowly rise over a period of time and residents are unable to make the payments.

"Yes, there will be an increase in property taxes; but it won't be anything substantial or overnight. It will be a gradual change over a few years," Fritz says. "Unfortunately, it's a catch 22 because you want the neighborhood to improve. But how do you pay for it?"

Fritz says if a homeowner's land is necessary for flood protection, he or she will be compensated. But, he adds, nothing like that has happened so far and the city's goal is not to "bulldoze" existing homes. In fact, he says, the city passed an ordinance last year limiting the development of buildings in West Dallas to two floors, to push future development further south of the two neighborhoods and retain the existing residential footprint.

"We want to minimize displacement. We don't want anyone to be forced to move out ... We don't want to kick anyone out or take anyone's homes away," Fritz says. "We want to empower them to live in an improved, vibrant neighborhood "

Paula Blackmon, chief of staff in Mayor Mike Rawlings' office, says she's not sure as to whether or not residents will have to

"If they want more information or help about this issue, have them contact us; we'll help them find the info they need," Blackmon

However, Blackmon stresses that the Trinity River Corridor Project is vital to the economic development and growth of Dallas as a

"The Trinity River has long bisected our community. This project will create an environment that we're hoping will bring people to the river and the water and will create flow to (both sides of the river)," she says.






### A Family Affair is a great summer weekend read
